- 4. The yellow house on Main St. formally owned by the Wilkersons and then the Youngs is now owned by Mr. Jerry Hall. There is no current water service to the house. The Sec. is directed to send a notice asking about water service.
- 5. Discussion held on the water service to the Cadjew house that is now owned by Norm McDonald. There is a temporary service connection in and Mr. McDonald has been advised that he must put the proper service to his house. A meter will also be installed by Chairman Hauck since the building will be used as a commercial building.
